MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD AT PENALLTA HOUSE, TREDOMEN ON THURSDAY, 1ST DECEMBER 2016 AT 2.00PM.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillors K. James (Cabinet Member for Regeneration, Planning and Sustainable Development), Mrs B. Jones (Cabinet Member for Corporate Services).

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest received at the commencement or during the course of the meeting.

3. APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO VARY THE MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN RESPECT OF THE STATUS OF THE PATH (RESTRICTED BYWAY 367 IN THE COMMUNITY OF ABERCARN) AND DIVERSION OF A SECTION OF THE RIGHT OF WAY

Members were asked to consider and determine the proposed correction to the minutes of the Rights of Way Cabinet Committee held on the 15th September 2014, a copy of which was appended to the report (Document 1). The minutes were approved as a correct record by Cabinet at its meeting on the 29th October 2014. Following this meeting it was noted that a correction was required as Recommendation 9 (i) Supporting the application as made that the status of the Definitive Map and Statement should be varied to change it from a Restricted Byway to a Footpath had been omitted. It was also noted that the report contained a further error in that it refers to Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980, which is a Stopping of the Right of Way, but should read refer to Section 119 for the Diversion of a Right of Way. This was the last Rights of Way Cabinet Committee held and this is the reason the minutes had not been corrected earlier.

At the meeting on 15th September 2014, Members were asked to consider two matters concerning the application. The first was whether the status of the right of way should be reclassified as a footpath (as per Para 3.1 (i) of the report) and secondly, whether the route should be diverted. Members resolved to agree to recommendation 9.1 (iii) and to approve the diversion of the right of way and this was included in the minutes. However, as the Members supported the application to vary the status of the Restricted Byway to a Footpath the width of the alternative Right of Way or path should be 1.8 metres and not 3 metres.

Following the meeting, a Modification Order was produced to change the status of Restricted Byway 367 in the Community of Abercarn to a Footpath. Objections were received to the Order and as the objectors would not withdraw their objections the Order was sent to the Welsh Government to determine. The Planning Inspectorate has arranged for the Modification Order to be considered by a Planning Inspector at a Public Inquiry on the 7th February 2017.

The Cabinet Members at this meeting were asked to amend the minutes to include recommendation 9 (i) of the report presented on the 15th September 2014:-

(i) approve the diversion of the right of way as shown in Document Number 15 which will be processed under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 in accordance with the following descriptions:-

and that in the description of the alternative way or path that the reference to 3 metres if restricted byway should be deleted.

Following consideration and discussion, it was moved and seconded that the recommendations at paragraph 10.1 (i) and 10.1 (3) in the report dated 1st December 2016, be approved. By a show of hands this was unanimously agreed.

RESOLVED that for the reasons contained in the Officer's report, the errors in the Minutes of the Rights of Way Cabinet held on the 15th September, 2014, be amended to correctly record the resolutions made by Members at that meeting as follows:-

- (i) supporting the application as made that the status of the Definitive Map and Statement should be varied to change it from a Restricted Byway to a Footpath and;
- (ii) approve the diversion of the Right of Way as shown in Document 15 which will be processed under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 in accordance with the following descriptions:-

Description of a section of the existing path or way to be diverted:-

(i) from the junction with Pant-y-Resk Road this path goes north along a footpath and passes at the farm and the road is then a cart road up to the junction with the road leading to Ty-Coedcae. (A-B)

Description of alternative path or way:-

- (i) a new path commences from the junction with Pant-y-Resk Road the path goes north west and then bears in a north easterly direction to reach the junction with the road leading to Ty-Coedcae (C-B). A total distance of 345 metres.
- (ii) the width of the alternative path or way to be consistent with the status agreed by members i.e. 1.8 metres footpath (as it is hedged on one side and fenced on the other).

4. APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO AMEND THE MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY IN RESPECT OF ADDING A PATH IN THE COMMUNITY OF GELLIGAER

Members were asked to consider and determine an application to add a path to the Definitive Map and Statement in the Community of Gelligaer. The application is made under Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 which is the discovery of evidence which would suggest the Right of Way should be recorded. The application could have been made under Section 53(3)(b) which is based upon long use in excess of twenty years.

Prior to the meeting Members and Officers walked the footpath from number 11 Ogilvie Terrace to the lane at the rear of number 4 Ogilvie Terrace, Deri.

The Rights of Way Support Officer delivered a presentation that provided the Committee with the background to the application. Reference was made to Document 1 (appended to the report) that sets out the evidence required to show that the footpath has been used for a period of 20 years without interruption and as a right. The date the footpath first came into question was 13th/14th August, 2015 and therefore the 20 year period of use commences from August 1995. However additional use before this period is also taken into consideration and two previous applications identify use of the claimed right of way of over 20 years dating back to 1972/73. The land was owned by Mr Shenkroff and is now owned by Mrs Gauden and Mr O'Connell.

The applicant and 28 supporters (who have completed evidence user forms and provided photographs of usage) state that the footpath has been used without interference for a period varying between 10 and 80 years. They confirmed that there has never been any signs stating that the claimed right of way was private land and no-one has prevented them from using it until the site was fenced off on 13th/14th August, 2015.

It was explained that one of the landowners states that during her family's ownership of the land (a period of 45 years) there was no intention to permit or dedicate a footpath across the site. The land had been purchased to build a residential property. Permissive rights were given for those parties who wished to walk their dogs across the site and for others who very occasionally had cause or wanted to use the diagonal route across the site. She categorically states that no permission was given for this to be a dedicated right of way and has always made it clear that it was their intention to build on the land. She considers that the footpath with steps and handrail was constructed by the Council and was on the understanding that this was to be dedicated as a footpath in substitution for the claimed footpath which is said to cross the site. Although the Dedication Agreement was not completed she feels this could be regularised.

Members were informed that the Planning Agent stated the land owners did not give consent to neighbours to cross the land as a right. He believes that the claimed right of way is unnecessary as there are footpaths to the northern and western site boundaries and ready access to footpaths to the south and east. He states that the unauthorised use of the claimed right of way has been infrequent and of little need and that the landowners never intended for their land to be used as a footpath and no consent was given for neighbours to use it.

The Committee were advised that it is not clear as to who constructed the footpath with the steps and handrail. Some residents claim that one of the residents was responsible for constructing the steps but the resident categorically refutes the claim and stated that the Council constructed the steps. The Engineers Department within the Council has failed to establish if they indeed constructed the steps. The footpath and steps are not part of the Authority's adopted highway and as such are not maintained.

Following the Officer's presentation of the report, Ms M. Thomas was invited to present her case on behalf of the Open Spaces Society. She read out her witness statement in support of the application and felt there is more than enough evidence that the diagonal path has been used by residents on a daily basis for more than 90 years continually. Other users have also

accessed the path, including visitors, delivery personnel and NHS workers. In concluding, Ms. Thomas stated there is overwhelming evidence to satisfy the requirements of a Modification Order under Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

Ms C. Sullivan, Planning Agent acting on behalf of Mr M. Toms then addressed the Committee. She explained the background to Mr Toms planning application and stated that the crucial point is that the area referred to is privately owned land. She referred to Document 60m, appended to the report (a letter dated 11th February 2016 sent from Ms K Gauden to the Local Authority). The letter states that at no time during her family's ownership of the land, which extended over a period of 45 years, did they intend to allow, permit or dedicate a footpath across the site. Ms Sullivan also referred to previous planning applications for residential development at the site that did not refer to a right of way. She felt that there are adequate alternative routes around the site for residents and a further new footpath will compromise the property and urged the Committee to reject the claim.

The Chair thanked all parties for their presentations and statements.

Members discussed the alternative routes referred to and felt that they were not a reason to reject the claim. On the balance of probabilities they questioned whether the path exists and stated that it is a Caerphilly County Borough Council Policy to allow Open Access to all. The Committee felt that it was not sufficient to show the property was private and they did not witness any attempts from the land owners to erect signs preventing use of the path. It was considered that the evidence was overwhelming that the path has been used for a number of years.

Following consideration and discussion, it was moved and seconded that the path be registered. By a show of hands this was unanimously agreed.

RESOLVED that the path be registered.

5. APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO AMEND THE MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN RESPECT OF ADDING A PATH IN THE COMMUNITY OF BEDWELLTY

Members were asked to consider and determine an application to add a path to the Definitive Map and Statement in the Community of Bedwellty.

Prior to the meeting Members and Officers walked the footpath that leads from Warne Street to Bryngwyn Street (A4049) Fleur-de-lis.

The Rights of Way Support Officer delivered a presentation that provided the Committee with the background to the application. The claimed right of way leads from the side of Woodland Lodge Residential Home, Warne Street in a south westerly direction to alongside the Bryngwyn Service Station to terminate on A4049 (Bryngwyn Street). The application is made under Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 which is the discovery of evidence which would suggest the right of way should be recorded. The Authority is not precluded from also taking into consideration a claimed right of way based on 20 years uninterrupted use. Evidence has been submitted that the claimed right of way is a public right of way and the route has been used by local residents for a considerable number of years. The date the footpath first came into question was 6th October, 2010, and therefore the 20 year period commences from 6th October, 1990. Evidence has been provided to show that the footpath A-B has been used on a regular basis for well over the 20 year period. Members were informed that historical maps confirm that a route was available along the claimed route in 1873-88; 1900-1904 and 1919 -1921. Aerial photographs also show a path along the line of the claimed Right of Way.

The Committee were advised that Mr. Davies, the owner of Bryngwyn Service Station has never stopped the local residents using the claimed right of way over land within his ownership and has verbally agreed to a path being separated from his Service Station.

Following consideration and discussion, it was moved and seconded that the path be registered as identified A-B-C in Document 3, appended to the report and new fencing to be installed alongside the footpath to separate it from the service area. By a show of hands this was unanimously agreed.

The Cabinet Members asked Officers to inform the Planning Department that should there be any issues in relation to the planning application for the fence, that this recommendation was endorsed by the Cabinet Rights of Way Committee.

RESOLVED that the path be registered as identified A-B-C in Document 3, appended to the report and new fencing to be installed alongside the footpath to separate it from the service area

6. APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO AMEND THE MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN RESPECT OF ADDING A PATH IN THE COMMUNITY OF ABERCARN

Members were asked to consider and determine an application to add a path to the Definitive Map and Statement in the Community of Abercarn.

Prior to the meeting Members and Officers walked the footpath from Gilboa Road to New Bryngwyn Road, Newbridge.

The Rights of Way Support Officer delivered a presentation that provided the Committee with the background to the application that is being dealt with under Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. This relates to the discovery of evidence which would suggest the right of way should be recorded. Reference was made to Document 1, appended to the report, that states the evidence submitted needs to show that the footpath has been used for a period of 20 years without interruption and as a right.

The Committee were advised that evidence has been submitted that the route has been used by local residents as a short cut for a considerable number of years. Local residents have stated that no notices have been erected stating that the footpath is private but the footpath has become overgrown and they have been unable to use it. The date the footpath first came into question is 16th September, 1993 and therefore the 20 year period commences from September 1973. The applicant and supporters state that the footpath has been used without interference for a period varying between 8 and 65 years.

It was explained that Llanover Estate, who own land over which a section of the claimed right of way crosses, are agreeable to the footpath being added to the Definitive Map and Statement.

Following consideration and discussion, it was moved and seconded that the path be registered. By a show of hands this was unanimously agreed.

RESOLVED that the path be registered

7. APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO AMEND THE MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN RESPECT OF ADDING A PATH IN THE COMMUNITY OF ABERCARN

Members were asked to consider and determine an application to add a path to the Definitive Map and Statement in the Community of Abercarn.

Prior to the meeting Members and Officers walked the footpath from High Street, adjacent to Oaktree House, crossing Windsor Avenue and proceeding between numbers 76 and 77, then dividing in two, proceeding west to Cwmtorlais Road and east to Tynewydd Terrace adjacent to number 31 Tynewydd Terrace, Newbridge. The application is being dealt with under Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. This relates to the discovery of evidence which would suggest the right of way should be recorded. The Local Authority is not precluded from also taking into consideration a claimed right of way based on 20 years uninterrupted use.

The Rights of Way Support Officer delivered a presentation that provided the Committee with the background to the application. She confirmed that evidence has been submitted that the route has been used by local residents for a considerable number of years.

Reference was made to Document 1, appended to the report that states the evidence submitted needs to show that the footpath has been used for a period of 20 years without interruption and as a right. The date the footpath first came into question was 2nd November, 1993 and therefore the 20 year period commences from November 1973. The Committee were advised that there is sufficient evidence to show that the footpaths A-B; C-D and D-F, as identified in the plan accompanying the report have been used on a regular basis for well over the 20 year period. This evidence was confirmed by way of historical maps dating back to 1873 and recent aerial photographs that were summarised in the report.

It was explained that Llanover Estate has agreed to enter into a Creation Agreement for the footpath E-D-G-H. This will resolve the problem with the extension of the garden of 31 Tynewydd Terrace. The remainder of the footpath A-B and C-D could then be dealt with by a Modification Order. The surface of the footpath A-B is a concern due to the probability of the former Urban District Council surfacing the footpath many years ago but it not being added to the Adoption Highway Records. Should an injury be sustained it might be difficult to defend as a previous Authority had resurfaced the footpath with tarmacadam.

Following consideration and discussion, it was moved and seconded that the footpath be registered and a Modification Order made for A-B and C-D and enter into a Creation Agreement with Llanover Estate for E-D-G-H. By a show of hands this was unanimously agreed.

RESOLVED that the footpath be registered as detailed in the report and a Modification Order made for A-B and C-D and enter into a Creation Agreement with Llanover Estate for E-D-G-H.

The meeting closed at 3.10 pm.

SUBJECT: APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION ORDER TO AMEND THE

CAERPHILLY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN RESPECT OF ADDING A

PATH IN THE COMMUNITY OF CAERPHILLY

REPORT BY: CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application to ADD a path to the Definitive Map and Statement in the Community of Caerphilly.

2. SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Authority is under a duty to resolve applications received under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 s.53(3).
- 2.2 The report sets out the evidence regarding the application to ADD a footpath from the Play area in Tredomen to Footpath 39 in the Community of Caerphilly.
- 2.3 The Committee should base their decision on the usage of the path for a 20 year period prior to 21st February 2005, the date that the application to add a footpath to the Definitive Map and Statement was submitted.

3. LINKS TO STRATEGY

- 3.1 The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 s.53 places a duty on the council to keep the Definitive Map and Statement under continuous review.
- 3.2 This report is to determine whether the Definitive Map and Statement should be modified and therefore links to the well-being goals would apply to Public Rights of Way in a wider context only.

4. THE REPORT

4.1 Background

- 4.1.1 This Committee has delegated powers to determine applications for Definitive Map Modification Orders under Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. This report relates to an application to ADD a path to the definitive map and statement. Document No. 1 gives an explanation of the term "public rights of way" and the role of this Committee.
- 4.1.2 The application is for a public right of way, leading from Park Lane along the access track leading to the allotments, then turns in a Southerly direction alongside the Children's play area, across the recreation ground and over the stream and into Coed-y-Twyn woods. The footpath continues in a South Easterly direction through the woods until it reaches a stream where it crosses into a field for a few meters and joins Footpath 39 Caerphilly. The claimed

right of way is being dealt with under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, Section 53(3)(c)(i).

4.2 Introduction

- 4.2.1 An application has been received from Mrs. Judith Lewis, 24 Tredomen Terrace, Ystrad Mynach under Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The application, submitted on the 21st February, 2005, is to modify the Definitive Map and Statement of Caerphilly County Borough Council by ADDING a footpath leading from the Play Area in Tredomen, Park Lane through Coed-y-Twyn woods to join Footpath 39 in the Community of Caerphilly. (Document No.4)
- 4.2.2 The location of the claimed right of way is shown on Document No. 2 within the circled area. This has been reproduced from the ordnance survey mapping by use of the Authority's Geographical Information System.
- 4.2.3 The route of the claimed path can be located in Document No.3 along a bold broken red line shown as A-B-C.
- 4.2.4 The Claimed Right of Way commences at the start of the access track leading to the Allotment Gardens (Grid ref: ST137943), it proceeds in a West-South-Westerly direction and then South alongside the Children's Playground and through the recreation field/public open space and then crosses the stream and enters into Coed-y-Twyn woods. It continues in a South-Easterly direction through the woods and then crosses a stream into the adjoining field to join Footpath No. 39 in the Community of Caerphilly (Grid ref: ST138941). The length of the claimed right of way is 305 metres or thereabouts.
- 4.2.5 The applicant notified the Authority, by submitting Notice W.C.A.7 that she had served notice on the landowners, Caerphilly Borough Council (A-B) and Ellen Corina Salton (B-C). The notice was sent to the Authority on 4th March, 2005. (Document No. 5)
- 4.2.6 However, when investigations commenced in 2017 Ellen Salton contacted the office to state that not all the landowners had been notified. The areas referred to are shown on Document No. 6. Following a land search with the Land Registry Office it is noted that the parcel of land between Ellen Salton's land and Caerphilly County Borough Council may belong to a third party if not Caerphilly Borough Council. The second strip of land belonged to the same third party.
- 4.2.7 Both sets of land owners feel that this application is invalid as notice was not originally served on all land owners. Correspondence from the legal representative of the primary land owner requested that the case be dropped and re initiated as notice had not been served on all land owners. A copy of this correspondence is attached as Documents No.7 and 8, the former being addressed to the Council and the latter to the applicant but copied to the Authority. This identifies the reasons why this application is considered invalid. Legal advice from CCBC is that despite the time taken and notice not being initially served on the above third party this does not nullify the claim or process as the determination had not commenced and the correct notices were later served and opportunity for comment given, as outlined below. Land ownership issues may not come to light until investigated. As such the case has been progressed.
- 4.2.8 In order to rectify this situation an e-mail was sent to the solicitors who were dealing with a sale of this land. The solicitors then provided the names and addresses of the three owners and the applicant was advised to send Notice W.C.A.6 to them and once this had been carried out to notify this Authority by sending Notice W.C.A.7. This Notice, dated 21st April 2017 was duly received as confirmation of the action taken. (Document No. 9). This land has subsequently been sold to Mr and Mrs Organ and their views are expressed later in this report.

- 4.2.9 Ms Salton acquired Coed-Y-Twyn Woods as part of the wider holding of Tir Twyn Farm during May 2002 and there after took actions to prevent public access through these woods on the basis that she did not believe her property had any public access rights and her stock were being injured by dogs. Actions undertaken included the erection of fencing and signage, blocking paths and informing users that the land was private and there were no access rights. Such actions have been undertaken on an on going basis since her purchase of the property and disputes continue.
- 4.2.10 Following the prevention of access by the land owner a residents meeting was held to discuss the matter and this has seemingly resulted the submission of this claim. It is understood that an initial application related to a circular route however this would not have been a legal claim as any claimed route is required to join highway to highway and as such was not considered. A subsequent application, duly made, was received on 21st February 2005 and this is the application before Members. This claim is supported by 21 User Evidence Forms. All of those who have completed Evidence User forms reside in the Tredomen area and have used the footpath on a regular basis. All but one have stated that they have used it for over 20 years and some have used it for over 50 years.
- 4.2.11 Evidence provided is summarised below and members considerations should be based on usage for the period of at least 20 years prior to the claim which is effectively, as a minimum 21st February 1985. Some of the people supplying evidence have since moved away or passed on however the evidence provided was done so correctly at the time. One such person is the original named applicant, Mrs Judith Lewis. Mrs Susan Smith has subsequently taken on this role and become the applicant.
- 4.2.12 In addition to the 2005 submissions further ratification and evidence was sought, from the claimants and objectors during 2017 and 2018. During this period people have continued to use the path and Ms Salton has made efforts to prevent this usage and there has been considerable correspondence between parties, notably regarding progress of the claim. Caerphilly County Borough own part of the land over which the claim is made and during June 2007 erected fencing and a stile on part of the boundary of it's property and the woodland. This was seemingly done as part of an animal trespass measure. The stile should seemingly not have been erected and was indeed removed shortly thereafter either by the Council or other party. Other unauthorised works, by third parties, have taken place on the Council holding including drainage clearance and laying of impromptu hardcore, the latter of which has been removed. The boundary between the council holding and Coed-y-Twyn Woods has again been recently fenced by Ms Salton.
- 4.2.13 Until recently all applications received under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 were dealt with on a date order of application basis which prevented this application being investigated although some work had been undertaken.
- 4.2.14 Research has been undertaken to determine the validity of the claim by collating any Documentary Evidence available as well as the crucial User Evidence provided by the local residents.

4.3 User Evidence

- 4.3.1 The complete set of User Evidence forms submitted in 2005 are attached as **Appendix 1**. The content of these is summarised below.
- 4.3.1 Detailed in Document No. 10 are the number of years the evidence users have used the footpath and it can be seen that the footpath has been used for over 50 years, as early as 1953.

- 4.3.2 Document No. 11 provides details of the frequency of use and the reason for using the footpath. It is noted that it is claimed the path has been used primarily by pedestrians with some limited equestrian usage. The usage of the path is mainly for amenity use, being used for dog walking, access to lower Ystrad Mynach, access to school, public transport and the Garden Centre as well as more general recreation.
- 4.3.3 The majority of users have confirmed that they have not asked permission to use the path and no notices were displayed stating that the path was private until Ms Salton purchased the area.
- 4.3.4. Some of the users confirm having seen both locals and strangers using the claimed right of way and some state that bicycles and horses were seen on the route although primarily evidence relates to walkers.
- 4.3.5 Further to the above, written confirmation was received, from a previous owner of the farm holding, Mrs C Miles, stating that members of the public had accessed the woodland for the ten year period she and her husband had owned the holding and for many years prior to this. The Miles' had owned the property from approximately 1992 until 2002. A copy of the letter is attached as Document No. 12.
- 4.3.5 The applicant, Mrs Smith and three other claimants, Messrs Cantwell, Elliott and Gardner were contacted during early 2017 to in part confirm continued intent in progressing the claim. All confirmed that they had used the path for between 28 and 46 years prior to the claim being made. Most used the path either daily or several times a week. Reasons for use were similar to those outlined above. These interviews are shown as Document No. 13.

4.3.6 Objector Evidence

Ms Salton's objection to access dates back to her purchasing the farm holding in May 2002 having erected the first signage in June/July 2002. Officers first met with her in 2004 when her position was made clear that she did not want any public access into her woodland and would oppose any claim as access was proving detrimental to both her farm income and welfare to stock and self. Since that date efforts have been made to preclude any access however some access continues and both damage and conflict are on going. Both Ms Salton and Mr Gareth Davies, who reside at Tir Twyn Farm, were interviewed on 5th February 2018.

- 4.3.7 Ms Salton purchased the property of Tir Twyn Farm on 21st May 2002 and has spoken to a number of people who had knowledge of her farm prior to purchase. Indeed prior to purchase Ms Salton lived in the Ystrad Mynach area so had some knowledge of the farm and access. She was unaware of any access through Coed-y-Twyn Woods and the land searches undertaken as part purchase revealed no public or private rights through the woods. She saw no visible sign of access to or from the property. The Rights of Way department confirmed there were no public rights of way through the woodland.
- 4.3.8 Her investigation of old maps did not indicate any access other than a path passing to the East of her holding, which she believes, if there is any right of way would have historically been along this route. Documentary evidence is provided below however in summary the 1959 1973 map (Document No. 18) indicates a footpath exiting land to the North-East of Coed-y-Twyn Woods and diagonally crossing the now public open space. Further to this there is some evidence both on plan and on the ground of a possible route passing along the boundary of Birchwood which exits the woodland at the same location. There are however no registered Public Rights of Way along these routes shown on the Definitive Map and Statement.
- 4.3.9 Ms Salton contends that even if the former owners, the Miles', had consented to access then this does not provide sufficient longevity to the claim, nor permission to cross onto her land from either direction, to substantiate it. She feels that other previous owners would not have consented to unauthorized access or the public being on the farm other than on statutory

rights of way. She had been informed of this by a Mr Morgan Thomas and Ken Jones both of whom had a good knowledge of the farm and of both a Mr Bosley the farm manager and the Rees' who were the historic long term landowners prior to the Miles'. Mr Jones has submitted evidence presented below.

- 4.3.10 The statement from Mr Gareth Davies confirmed that he also grew up in the Ystrad Mynach area and had a knowledge of the farm and woodlands. He was never of the opinion that there was any public access into these woods despite being resident for some 50 years and enjoying outdoor recreation.
- 4.3.11 Mr Ken Jones has made a statement, dated 14th February 2018, supporting Ms Salton. He is a local resident of Bryn Mynach Avenue, Tredomen who has a knowledge of the farm going back over 60 years. He worked on the farm during the 1960's and has continued knowledge of it. He states that the woodland was fenced off as part of a well managed farm and the farm manager, Mr Bosley, would not allow public access other than on the registered public footpath (Footpath 39) other than by express permission. The woodlands were used as part of the farm. He also believes that if there were a path it should follow a route which does not transverse the Tir Twyn holding. A copy of Mr Jones statement is attached as Document No. 14.
- 4.3.12 The owners of Woodfield Nursery, Mr David and Mrs Tracey Organ, were interviewed on 22nd October 2018. They purchased the land referred to in section 4.2.3 on 26th April 2018. Whilst their purchase is considerably after the claim date they never the less hold title and have a knowledge of the area dating back to, in Mr Organs' case the 1960's and some 36 years for Mrs Organ and have resided at the nursery site for many years. Both are of the view that there was never a formal footpath through Coed-Y-Twyn Woodlands and any legitimate access was by express permission only. Mr Organ was friendly with a Mr Douglas Badham who owned part of the wood and adjoining ground and Mr Organ also knew the Rees sisters who employed Mr Fred Bosley as farm manager, mentioned above. Mr Organ felt that whilst the Morgans, who owned the farm after the Rees' may have been lax in terms of managing the ground and controlling public access the previous owners were not and Mr Bosley would not permit the public access and the Rees sisters, who owned the holding, did not want it. Likewise Mr Badham did not permit access over land under his control beyond any statutory rights.
- 4.3.13 Having grown up in the area Mr Organ was not aware of any route through these woods although was aware that people did sometimes go into them, as they do on all land around the urban fringe. This he states was more to go into the woods rather than using it as a route to link between footpaths, indeed there was little need as there was a better route cutting up from Bryn Mynach, this is the route he would have used. The Organs are aware that there is more usage of the woods now, some for illicit reasons and indeed the police have been involved in some instances, but historically those accessing the woods without permission were not doing so to access other paths but rather walk within the woods and hence the residents initial attempt to claim a circular route.
- 4.3.15 Copies of the objection received from Marchant Harries Solicitors are referred to earlier in the report (4.2.7) and as Document Nos. 7 and 8.

4.4 Documentary Evidence

4.4.1 The documentary evidence studied in conjunction with the User Evidence is outlined below. During the investigation of a claimed route a near match to the claimed footpath was looked for on all the maps listed below.

Historical Map dated 1873-1888 (Document No. 15)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Historical Map dated 1900-1904 (Document No. 16)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Historical Map dated 1919-1921 (Document No.17)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Historical Map dated 1959-1973 (Document No.18)

Footpath indicated to North and East of Coed-Y-Twyn woods.

Historical Map dated 1959-1992 (Document No. 19)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Historical Map dated 1971-1992 (Document No. 20)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Provisional Map 1st May 1964 – (Document No. 21)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Special Review Map 20th December 1990 – (Document No. 22)

There is no indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Aerial Photograph dated 1958 (Document No. 23)

Although not very clear, routes similar to those indicated on the 1959 – 1973 map are apparent.

Aerial Photograph dated 1972 (Document No. 24)

Taken in March 1972. Limited tree cover allows some sight of the ground, but no path is apparent.

Aerial Photograph dated 1974 (Document No. 25)

There is **some** indication from this map of the claimed right of way.

Aerial Photograph dated 1991 (Document No. 26)

Public Right of Way 39 can be seen as a worn path. There is an indication of a path crossing the Council owned land along the line of the claim although not possible to track through the woodland.

There are no historic photographs prior to 2005.

4.5 Land Ownership

4.5.1 As outlined in the introduction, form W.C.A. 6 was served on both Ellen Salton as land owner of Tir Twyn Farm and Caerphilly County Borough as owner of the public open space. This informed of the application being made under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to add the footpath to the Definitive Map and Statement. When additional owners came to light in 2017 further forms were served on the identified owners as well as to those previously issued.

Notification of this by W.C.A. 7 was received by the Authority on 21st April 2017 (Document No. 9). The additional land requiring notice refers to a small length of path exiting the southern side of Coed-Y-Twyn Woods before joining Footpath 39 Caerphilly, a distance of some 8 metres. At the opposite end of the path where it exits Coed-Y-Twyn Woods to the North it is possible the path also crosses a metre or so of land held by the above owners although this is unclear as three ownerships converge at this point. Land ownership has changed since these forms were served however the new owners are aware of the claim and have made representations.

4.6 SUMMARY

- 4.6.1 The Authority is using Section 53 (3)(c)(i) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 as the main test of whether or not the claimed right of way should be added to the Definitive Map and Statement. This is used when the Authority discovers evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a public path. However, the Authority is not precluded from also taking into consideration a claimed right of way based on 20 years uninterrupted use. The right must be reasonably alleged to exist.
- 4.6.2 The Authority has been made aware that evidence exists which suggests that the claimed right of way is a public right of way and has been used as such for many years. The Authority has received an application to add a footpath to the Definitive Map and Statement.
- 4.6.3 As detailed in Document No. 1, the evidence submitted needs to show that the footpath has been used for a period of 20 years without interruption and as a right. The date the footpath first came into question is 21st February 2005, and therefore the 20 year period commences from 21st February 1985. Evidence has been provided to show that the footpath shown as 'A-B-C' on Document No. 3, has been used on a regular basis for well over the 20 year period. Evidence has also been provided that refutes this claim.
- 4.6.4 On some of the historical maps paths are shown leading to and from the woods although none are along the specific route of this claim.
- 4.6.5. From the aerial photographs little evidence is identifiable prior to 2005 possibly in part as the claimed route passes through woodland.

5. CABINET COMMITMENT TO THE CORPORATE PLAN

5.1 This report relates to a statutory function of the Council.

6. WELL-BEING OF FUTURE GENERATIONS

- 6.1 This report contributes to the Well-being Goals as set out in Links to Strategy above. It is consistent with the five ways of working as defined within the sustainable development principle in the Act in:
 - Long Term The action maintains the Definitive Map and Statement for future generations.

7. EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

7.1 An Equalities Impact Assessment is not needed because the issues covered are for information purposes only, therefore the Council's full EIA process does not need to be applied.

8. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8.1 The cost of a Modification Order should Members resolve to support the application, is in the region of £1,800.00. If the Modification Order is approved then there will be an additional cost

to provide some upgrading of the path and associated infrastructure.

9. PERSONNEL IMPLICATIONS

9.1 None.

GENERAL CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED FOR THE PROTECTION OF APPARATUS AND THE PREVENTION OF DISRUPTION TO GAS SUPPLIES.

General conditions affecting the design, construction or maintenance of services and/or structures or other works in the vicinity of Wales & West Utilities (WWU) plant, pipelines and associated installations:

These general conditions apply only to the gas apparatus and pipes operated by WWU. It is possible that there may be other gas transporters with apparatus in the vicinity; therefore you should ensure that you have made enquiries of them and have complied with their requirements.

1. GRAPHIC REPRESENTATION OF GAS MAINS

Any plans supplied or marked up by WWU will indicate the **APPROXIMATE** location of its apparatus. This information is provided as a general guide only; its accuracy cannot be guaranteed and is given without obligation or warranty. Service pipes are not shown but their presence should be anticipated. No liability whatsoever is accepted by WWU, its agents or servants for any error, omission, discrepancy or deviation. Plans on site should be current, i.e. no older than 28 days from the date of issue. Gas pipes owned by other Gas Transporters, or otherwise privately owned, may be present in this area (pink areas indicated on our plans). Information with regard to such pipes should be obtained from the relevant owners.

2 METHODS OF WORKING

The following methods of work shall not normally be permitted within the limits of distance indicated (relative to the established pipe position). Any variances must have consent from WWU before works commence on site:

Mechanical Excavation3m (1m for low pressure mains)Hydraulic Testing8 mPiling / Pile removing / Boring15mWelding or other hot works*15mDirectional Drill Operations15mExplosives250m

* NOTE: Welding or other hot works involving naked flames shall be carried out at a safe distance to the satisfaction of a WWU Engineer. A check should be made prior to the commencement of works, to ensure a gas free atmosphere exists. It is also necessary to monitor the atmosphere at regular intervals for the duration of the works. In no case shall such activities take place in any Wales & West Utilities Easement without the written consent and in the presence of a WWU representative.

WWU must be consulted prior to carrying out any excavation work within **10m** of any above or below ground gas installations or pipeline. No excavation works may commence within **50m** of a High Pressure or Very High Pressure Pipeline unless the pipeline has been located by tracing and its precise route identified.

In addition to the above methods of working, WWU must be contacted prior to any External Wall Installation (EWI) schemes, proposed solar farms and wind turbine installations.

No work shall be undertaken near, nor heavy plant or equipment moved over, any gas pipeline or apparatus until all of the conditions specified by WWU have been complied with.

Where WWU have apparatus in the vicinity of your work, any damage to it could have serious consequences. In view of this and in the interests of safety, a meeting should be arranged before the commencement of work on site between WWU representatives, representatives of the promoting authority, the contractors and any other interested parties. At this meeting the suggested program of site works and plant safety should be discussed. It is essential that this meeting is convened well in advance of commencement on site. Access to WWU plant and facilities for inspection by WWU staff must not be affected. Where formal consent has been given, A MINIMUM OF SEVEN DAYS NOTICE IS REQUIRED before carrying out work in WWU easements, or the appropriate notice under the New Roads & Street Works Act (NRSWA) where existing plant is situated within the public highway.

3. PROXIMITY OF OTHER PLANT

A minimum clearance of **600 millimetres (mm)** should be allowed between all plant being installed and an existing gas main operating above 2 bar medium pressure (MP), whether the adjacent plant is parallel to or crossing the gas pipe. For mains operating at MP or below, this distance can be reduced to 300mm. **NO APPARATUS SHOULD BE LAID OVER AND ALONG THE LINE OF A GAS PIPE, IRRESPECTIVE OF CLEARANCE**.

No manhole or chamber shall be built over or around a gas pipe and no work should be carried out which results in a reduction of cover or protection over a pipe without consultation with and the agreement of WWU staff.

4. PROTECTION

Where any works cross or run in close proximity to WWU apparatus, periodic visits must be made by a WWU engineer. His requests for protection or support to the apparatus shall be immediately observed.

Suitably designed crossing points are to be constructed to the satisfaction of a WWU Engineer. These crossing points shall be clearly indicated by the erection of bunting and crossings at other places should be prevented.

Backfill material adjacent to WWU apparatus shall be soft fill or sand, containing no stones, bricks, or lumps of concrete etc., placed to a minimum 150mm around the mains and is to be well compacted by hand. No power consolidation shall take place above the main until 300mm of soft fill has been compacted by hand.

5. DAMAGE TO COATINGS

Where a gas pipe is coated with special wrapping and this is damaged, even to a minor extent, WWU must be notified so that repairs can be made to prevent future corrosion and subsequent leakage. WHERE MINOR DAMAGE TO COATING IS REPORTED TO WWU PRIOR TO BACKFILL, THE NECESSARY REPAIR WILL BE MADE FREE OF CHARGE.

6. CATHODIC PROTECTION

Where WWU apparatus is cathodically protected either by sacrificial anode or impressed current systems and where new apparatus is to be laid and is to be similarly protected, WWU will require to carry out interaction tests to determine whether its own system is adversely affected. The cost of any mutually agreed remedial action will be recharged to the authority installing the new apparatus. If any bond wires, test leads etc., used in connection with cathodic protection systems are damaged or found to be in poor condition, broken or disconnected, WWU must be notified prior to backfilling so that a repair can be made.

7. HOT WORKS

Even when a gas free atmosphere exists care must be taken when carrying out hot works in close proximity to gas plant in order to ensure that no damage occurs. Particular care must be taken to avoid damage by heat or naked flames to plastic gas pipes or to the protective coatings on other pipes.

8. DEMOLITION

Live gas services must be disconnected **PRIOR** to demolishing any property, arrangements must be made for WWU to check for the presence of any live gas services.

9. TREE PLANTING

WWU must be contacted prior to all tree-planting works above or near our apparatus. Further information can then be made available.

10. DEEP EXCAVATIONS

Any work involving deep excavations (1.5m or more) will be subject to the "Model Consultative Procedure for Pipeline Construction involving Deep Excavations". This may require the diversion of WWU apparatus prior to the commencement of your works. Detailed plans and cross sections will be required in order to determine the effect of these works on WWU apparatus.

11. RENEWABLE ENERGY INSTALLATIONS

Wind Turbines - WWU must be advised of any planned development of wind turbines in the vicinity of an above 2 bar gas pipelines to ensure the development does not impact on the future safe operation of the pipeline. Industry guidance states that any wind turbine must be sited no closer than 1.5 times the proposed height of the turbine mast away from the nearest edge of the pipeline.

Solar Farms - WWU must be contacted regarding planned solar farms being considered in the vicinity of WWU gas pipelines.

EWI - WWU must be contacted regarding any EWI scheme to ensure the scheme does not impact upon WWU's apparatus.

12. LEAKAGE FROM GAS MAINS OR SERVICES

If damage or leakage is caused or an escape of gas is smelt or suspected the following action should be taken at once:

- Remove all personnel from the immediate vicinity of the escape.
- Inform the 24hr Gas Emergency Service on 0800 111 999
- Prevent any approach by the public, prohibit smoking, and extinguish all naked flames or other sources of ignition for at least 15 metres from the leakage. Do not operate any electrical switches in the vicinity of the escape.
- Assist gas personnel, Police and/or Fire Services as requested.

IN THE EVENT OF A LEAK, OBSERVE THE ABOVE BUT DO NOT ATTEMPT TO SEAL THE LEAK REMEMBER - IF IN DOUBT; SEEK ADVICE FROM WWU

13. BUILDING PROXIMITIES

There are minimum proximity distances for buildings from WWU mains depending on both the operating pressure and the material of the main. Advice should be sought from WWU prior to building works taking place to confirm these distances. For High Pressure pipelines you must seek further guidance from the HSE and Local Authority Planning team regarding their PADHI distances regarding building proximities as these may be in addition to WWU proximity distances for a pipeline.

Temporary buildings should not be placed above any gas pipe or within 3.0 metres of mains operating above 75mbar (medium, intermediate and high pressure mains) during construction activities and in no circumstances should permanent structures be built over any pipe transporting gas.

14. SITE RESPONSIBILITIES

All costs incurred by WWU for the repair of direct or consequential damage to gas plant will be rechargeable (with the exception of paragraph 5). WWU reserves the right to divert any affected apparatus or alternatively specify suitable protection of its apparatus. If proved necessary during the course of site works, the cost of which will be chargeable.

The above requirements do not relieve you of the responsibility of taking all precautions necessary to safeguard the Company's plant and to avoid risk to persons and property. The persons for whom the works are being undertaken, their servants, agents and contractors shall indemnify WWU servants, agents and contractors against any loss, damage, expenses, claims and actions incurred or brought against Wales & West Utilities, its servants, agents and contractors in consequence of the provision of these works and activities associated therewith or ancillary thereto.



ROLE OF COMMITTEE AND TERMS OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

 The term "public rights of way" is used to mean paths, tracks and unmetalled roads over which the public have the right to walk and in some cases ride horses and possibly drive motor vehicles.

These may be classified as follows:-

A **footpath** over which the right of way is on foot only.

A **bridleway** over which there is a right of way on foot and

on horseback or leading a horse, and also

for the use of a pedal cycle.

A <u>byway open to all</u> over which the public have a right of way for traffic vehicular and all other kinds of traffic, but

which is used by the public mainly for the purpose for which footpaths and bridleways

re se used

are so used.

- 2) The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 places a duty on the County Borough Council to keep the existing definitive map under continuous review, make Modification Orders as necessary to take account of the occurrence of events requiring the map to be modified and to prepare definitive maps for any part of the area not previously surveyed.
- The definitive map and statement will be modified by means of Orders made by the surveying authority i.e. the County Borough Council. The Wildlife and Countryside Act enables any person to apply to the surveying authority for an order to amend the definitive map.
- 4) The procedure for making such an application is detailed in Schedule 14 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act. The application before you complies with these requirements.
- 5) When determining the application members will be acting in a quasijudicial capacity. Before making an order, members must be satisfied that the evidence shows, **on the balance of probabilities**, that a right of way of a particular description exists. Each application must be dealt with on its own merits, noting the interests of both the applicants and the landowners.
- 6) This application is concerned with rights that are alleged to exist and not as to whether it would be prudent or beneficial to create them. The suitability of a way for users who have a right to use it, for example the nuisance that they are alleged to cause are not factors that should be

considered by the Committee. **Members are also required to view the route of the proposed right of way in question.**

7) When considering the evidence that follows, members must be aware of the provisions of Section 31 of the Highways Act 1980 thus enabling members to determine whether there is sufficient weight of evidence to make an order.

Section 31 of the Highways Act states:-

"where a way over any land other than a way of such a character that use of it by the public could not be given rise at common law to any presumption of dedication, has been actually enjoyed by the public as a right and without interruption for a full period of 20 years, the way is to be deemed to have been dedicated a highway unless there is sufficient evidence that there was no intention during that period to dedicate it."

If in the case before you members are satisfied that the right of way has been used for a period in excess of 20 years, then there arises a presumption that the owner intended to dedicate the path as a right of way. It should be noted by members that the said 20 year period must be calculated retrospectively from the date when the way was first called into question.

8) If following the site visit the Committee decides to make an Order, then once this decision has been reached the County Borough Council has to give notice of its general effect. Following members' decision there is a right of appeal to the Welsh Minister. A period of at least 42 days from the date of first publication of the notice must be allowed for objections.

If there are any valid objections the County Borough Council has to refer the Order, together with the objections to the Welsh Ministers who will then arrange for the Order and the objections to be considered by an independent Inspector. If no valid objections are made within the objection period then the County Borough Council may confirm the order itself as an unopposed Order. Caerphilly County Borough Council CROW194 - Location






We refer to our recent exchanges. We yesterday received a copy of a notice of application and enclose a copy for your information and consideration.

For the reasons outlined in previous correspondence, we consider that the original application is fatally defective and that it would be an abuse of process to determine it at this remove. We also consider that the purported adoption of the application by Mrs Susan Smith is a nullity. We enclose a copy of the letter which we have today sent to Mrs Smith.

We have also seen the email sent to Ms Salton by Mr Richard Salt of your legal department. In our opinion, it traverses the issues particularly in relation to the time which has elapsed since the original application was made. In our view, the proper course of action is for a fresh application to be made and considered on the current merits. We shall be grateful if you will confirm that you do not intend to proceed with your investigation of the previous application.

If we do not receive that assurance we will have to consider with our clients whether we should apply for injunctive relief to restrain the Council from dealing with the matter over 12 years after it was submitted. For the Council now to consider the matter, would, we submit, be both unfair and "Wednesbury unreasonable". Kindly acknowledge receipt of this letter.

Re: Application to Amend the Footpath Map

I confirm that we have today received in the post a copy of the attached application with supporting maps. We confirm that our clients own part of the land potentially affected by this application.

We consider that the notice which you have given is defective in a number of ways:-

- You are self-evidently not the original applicant. There is no provision in the Act or the Regulations which allows for the substitution of one applicant for another.
- 2. The original application was, we understand, made in 2005. However, our clients were never served with it and it is apparent from the copy of the original application which we have seen that the original applicant did not attempt to serve our clients, nor did she apply for permission to affix notices to the property in lieu.
- 3. Under Paragraph 2 Schedule 14 Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 the applicant is required to certify that the application has been served on every owner and occupier of any land to which the application relates. We have not seen any such certificate but, prior to yesterday, no such declaration could have been made.
- 4. Affected owners and occupiers are entitled to have details of the evidence on which the application is based so that they may make their views known to the local authority. We have not received copies of any of the supporting statements. Arguably, therefore, service is defective on this ground.
- 5. Given that this application was lodged in 2005 and is only now being made subject to determination, our clients are irretrievably prejudiced by being unable to investigate the state of affairs as it existed in 2005. It must be the case that the application falls to be determined by the state of affairs in existence at the time when the application was made. If it is intended to take account of matters or events since 2005, a fresh application needs to be made.
- Although there is no express time limit for the Council to consider these applications it is selfevidently an abuse of process for the local authority to decide to determine the application 12 years after it was made.
- Overall, we consider that the application was, and remains, defective and because of the lapse
 of time the defects are not capable of remedy.

Statement of Ken Idris Jones -14 Coed Y Haf Tredomen Ystrad Mynach, CF82 7DF.

DOB 29.03.50

I make this statement in relation to the Claimed right of way through Coed Y Twyn Woods and matters in connections with Ms Ellen Salton (ne Kidd) of Tir Twyn Farm ,Tredomen ,Ystrad Mynach CF82 7BF.

I also wish to make comment concerning the Claimant and local woman known as Sue Smith of Maesycoed terrace Tredomen.

I have lived in Brynmynach for 64 years .I am very familiar with Tir Twyn farm and the occupants over time .When I was a teenager I frequently worked at the farm for the then farm manager or bailiff called Fred Bosley and the owners the Rees family.

This was on an ad hoc basis, haymaking and general farm labouring .Mr Bosley ran the farm well but was very strict when it came to visitors to the farm and in particular with trespassers .No areas of the farm were available for people to wander where they pleased and the only accepted route over the land was the public right of way i.e. footpath 39 as it now is .The woods known as Coed y Twyn woods were fenced off and were used as part of the farm. The historical deeds of the farm show that no other rights of way, permissive or otherwise were granted while the farm belonged to the Rees family and the farm has been in the Rees family for hundreds of years. The only way anyone would have been allowed to walk anywhere other than the footpath would have been with the express permission of the owners.

I have known Ellen Salton (Kidd) for many years and I am a visitor to her farm, I have kept Bees at her farm over the years previously. I have become aware over the last 13 to 14 years of difficulties Ellen has endured with trespassers and those trying to claim a right of way through her land, as well as the hostility, abuse and slander she has faced from some local people owing to her refusing access.

I am aware of her fences being cut deliberately over and over again to let her cattle out and cause worry, embarrassment and danger. I am also aware of continued trespass and harassment she and her family are enduring.

Ellen Has often been very distressed and frustrated with regard to the actions of Mrs Sue Smith in particular.

I have experienced first-hand the vitriol shown toward Mrs Salton by this woman .I was Vice chairman of the local community partnership and approximately two to two and a half years ago, following one of our meetings I clearly overheard Mrs Smith complain to local Councillor, Martin James that Ms Salton and her clients were damaging council property in the penallta park .Mrs Smith seemd hell bent on creating a terrible image of Ms Salton so

much so Martin James repeated the same to me about what Ms Salton was supposed to be doing.

I know that up to this tme Ellen hadn't ridden a horse in 5 year's owng to a serious back problem and I also know that Ellen would never condone such actions from anyone or do anything like this herself. Ellen runs a good and reputable business; this utterance was done to delberatly cause harm to Ms Saltons reputation and slander her name.

Mrs Smith's demeanour and body language was aggressive and her words vindictive.


I told Councillor James that the rumours were utter nonsense. I explained that horses are often seen in Parc Penallta as there is a legitimate bridle path there plus many people ride there not just people from Ms Saltons yard.

I have personally discussed with Mrs Smith the local rights of way and the previous existence of a path visible on all maps and indeed visible to the naked eye which abuts Ms Salton woods but does not traverse it, it follows behind the house known as Birch grove in Tredomen next to the play area enclose a map to show this path .It seems that this path was not adopted on the definitive map by previous Councils or Caerphilly Council, my view is it should have been and should be now .I Believe the fact in this statement are accurate and true to the best of my knowledge.

Extract of the Provisional Map




Extract of the Special Review Map
