NCS explained that the existing BT service provision on site determined the lay-bys width. A site meeting took place on 25/4 with CCBC officers. A further meeting on 9/5 between CCBC officers and retailers, agreed to re-examine the location of the Barclays Bank crossing and the size of the lay-by by undertaking a safety audit. The safety audit has highlighted 36 areas requiring attention most of which will be corrected by the contractor and are of a minor nature. The main area of concern is the lack of visibility at the pelican crossing outside Barclays bank. It is proposed to shorten the lay by to correct this. The costings for this work been passed to NCS who will undertake the works. There will be a temporary reduction in length of lay by outside Spar Square then following the construction of Angel Way a one-way system will be put in place and these temporary restrictions will be lifted.
