SUBJECT: CORPORATE PRIORITIES AND IMPROVEMENT OBJECTIVES 2014/15

REPORT BY: HEAD OF PERFORMANCE AND PROPERTY

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 The Local Government Measure 2009 requires all local authorities in Wales to set and publish a set of priorities called Improvement Objectives. The Wales Audit Office (WAO) will use these Improvement Objectives to evaluate the council's likelihood of improvement and following that, the level of actual improvement that is achieved for the citizens of Caerphilly. Additionally the Council wants to publish a Corporate Plan in July 2014 which details its longer term priorities and in future this plan will be the vehicle for publishing both longer term priorities and shorter term objectives to the public.
- 1.2 The Council is required to review their Improvement Objectives to ensure they remain relevant and current. This report details the outcome of this process and identifies the Cabinet recommended set of Priorities and Improvement Objectives for 2014/15.

2. SUMMARY

2.1 This report shows the chosen Aspirations, Priorities and Improvement Objectives for 2014-2015. The Improvement Objectives (Appendix A) are required to be published before the end of June 2014.

3. LINKS TO STRATEGY

3.1 The local Government Measure 2009 requires each authority to publish priorities for improvement called Improvement Objectives

4. THE REPORT

- 4.1 The Improvement Objectives must be published as soon as possible after the end of the financial year and although not stated in legislation the informal expectation is no later than the end of the first quarter (June 2012). Although there is no requirement to publish a corporate plan, this is the chosen is the vehicle for publishing the Councils longer- term priorities and will include the Improvement Objectives so a full set is published.
- 4.2 Improvement Objectives will be published by the end of June as part of discharging our statutory improvement duty and it is suggested that the fuller Corporate Plan be published by the end of July 2014 to allow for the more detailed work that will be required to create a robust plan. The Corporate Plan will be made up of three aspects.

- 4.3 The first aspect is the Councils long-term aspirations and vision and these are listed below:
 - Our communities must be safe, green and clean places to live to improve resident's quality
 of life.
 - We want to improve job opportunities in our County Borough, so people can live better lives.
 - Our goal is that every child should have the best start in life, and the opportunity to achieve success as a young person and as an adult
 - We want to enable our communities to make healthy lifestyle choices to improve citizens' quality of life
 - We want to improve accessibility throughout the county borough
 - · Our council homes, lives and lives and communities
- 4.4 These were set in November 2012 as the Councils Corporate Priorities for 2013-17 although they were not published in a 'Corporate Plan' at that time. In 2014/2015 Cabinet reviewed its set of priorities and in light of the difficult financial climate chose a more medium term specific set of priorities, whilst retaining the first overall set as noted above in 4.3.
- 4.5 Part of the review asked the following questions to establish the priorities and objectives for 2014/2015:-

Relevance - Is this area still relevant where there is an 'unmet' need?

Consultation – are these still what the citizens want?

Funding – Does the Medium Term Financial Plan affect whether some of these activities can still be delivered? Has external (central government, home office etc) funding affected the delivery of these objectives?

Is there any new legislation, demographic or any other changes that need to be taken into account?

4.6 Following the review Cabinet decided on the following revised set of Priorities and to retain the same Improvement Objectives as last year for 14/15. They are listed as follows:-

- 4.7. Where possible the long term aspirations, priorities and Improvement Objectives are designed to have connections and links to each other.
- 4.8 Also taken into consideration was 13/14 consultation results, where people were asked what they thought was missing from the Councils improvement objectives. A number of respondents noted that the Improvement Objectives were focussed towards younger people and commented that there should be more focus on Adult Care and improving job and business opportunities for all age groups. Adult care therefore is addressed in the Councils longer- term priorities and aspirations, whilst job opportunities for all ages are predominantly addressed within the Councils Partnership document the Single Plan. Whilst we were successful in 13/14 we believe we have more to do to therefore we recommend retaining the 13/14 objectives and carrying them forward into 14/15 (Appendix A). Full progress updates of each 13/14 objectives will go to their respective scrutiny with a fuller public account of all Improvement Objectives in October 2014
- 4.9 The Councils Statutory responsibility is to publish a full description of each Improvement objective and its outcomes (what difference to we aim to make) and this is noted below.

6.1 A review of the Council's Medium Term Financial Plan against the 6 improvement objectives shows there are no cuts that will adversely affect their delivery at this time but this will remain under review.
