It was agreed to write to all secondary schools congratulating them on this years examination performance particularly indicating the very good performance at GCSE full course again this year.

- Short course standards were being maintained, comparable with previous performance and All Wales figures.
- · Improved results at A-C Level at A level this year.
- AS results better than previous performance and ALL Wales figures
- Significantly increased uptake for Short Course, A Level and AS Level.
