Blaenau Gwent - Revd /Y Parch. Patrick Coleman

Patrick was born and educated in Pontypool, South Wales, and studied for ordination at the Venerable English College, Rome, with later doctoral studies in Munich. He was ordained a priest in 1983 and worked for 9 years in the Roman Catholic Church before deciding that he could not with integrity represent that church's exclusive stance on its nature and relationship to truth.
