

2. 2009 examination: Improvements to layout of Question Paper Answer Books in order to support candidates

Following the 2008 examinations in GCSE Religious Studies Specification A Paper 1C St Mark's Gospel and Paper 2B Effects of the Roman Catholics Tradition upon Aspects of Christian Lifestyle and Behaviour, we have made improvements to the layout of the question paper answer booklets in order to further support candidates. It would be most helpful if you could draw the following instructions to the attention of candidates taking 2009 examinations in Units 1C and 2B.

Essay plans

Essay plans and rough work must **not** be written on the insert; candidates should write them either at an appropriate point in the question paper answer booklet or on additional sheets which should be tied loosely to the back of the answer booklet.

Answer Space

Candidates will continue to be instructed to answer Parts A and B in the spaces provided in the question paper answer booklet. In Part C, candidates will, for the first time in 2009, have a choice of questions to answer. Candidates will be asked to answer **two** questions from the four provided. Candidates will be instructed to write their answers to the first question selected in Part C on, for example, pages 9 to 14, and to write their answers to the second question in Part C on, for example, pages 15 to 20. As a result of this instruction, candidates will be directed to

produce any rough work and / or essay plans on continuation sheets and to attach these to the back of their answer booklet.

Specimen Instructions

Provided, as an attachment, are specimen instructions as they will appear on the front of the question paper answer booklet and at the start of the answer spaces for Part C questions. 


