

# EDUCATION FOR LIFE SCRUTINY COMMITTEE – 6TH NOVEMBER 2012

SUBJECT: CONSULTATION ON WELSH MEDIUM SECONDARY PROPOSAL

# 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek the views of Scrutiny Members, on the above proposal, as part of the formal consultation process.

## 3. THE REPORT

- 3.1 Council, at its meeting on 7th August, agreed to the commencement of statutory processes in respect of the former St. Ilan site Welsh-medium development.
- 3.2 The formal consultation process commenced on 1 October 2012 and concludes on 30th November 2012.
- 3.3 A detailed consultation document (attached) was circulated to a range of consultees seeking their views on this proposal. As part of this process Scrutiny Committee views are also being requested. A range of meetings have been convened including a Public/Community meeting on Tuesday 13 November. A drop-in session has also been organised on the same date.

# 4. EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

4.1 A detailed equality impact assessment has been produced and has been distributed to consultees, as well as being available on-line via the Intranet.

# 5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 These are detailed in the consultation document. The commentary refers to a previous Council decision but in view of a delay in completion of Phase 1 from September 2012 to September 2013 the funding has similarly been delayed and will now reflect a part year funding in 2013/14 with a full year effect in 2014/15.

6.1 These will be dependent upon the development of the site and in accordance with the formula funding of schools.
