GV17 URGENT ITEMS

The Chairman, Councillor J.R. Davies, certified that because of the need to determine further applications without delay, it was in his opinion, that the following applications were urgent matters within the terms of Section 100(B)(4) of the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 and should be dealt with at this meeting.

KICK Youth and Community Project, Caerphilly

KICK is due to move to new premises, the former indoor market place in Caerphilly. The building will encompass a Cyber cafe, music workshop, training/education facilities and a sports area. Proceeds from the sale of the previous building will be used to refurbish the new building and a team of project staff will be funded by the National Assembly. KICK are currently trying to raise £3,000 in order to provide computers for the Cyber cafe and any donation would be welcome.

RESOLVED that a grant of £250 be made towards this project

Ystrad Fawr 4 Couple Junior Latin Team

The above is a new team with 10 junior members, which has entered the British Open Junior Latin Dance Championship to be held in Blackpool during April. The team are raising funds to purchase tracksuits, practice and performance outfits. An unspecified grant is sought towards these costs.

RESOLVED that a grant of £60 be made towards the cost of purchasing tracksuits, practice and performance outfits

GV18 WELSH CHURCH ACTS FUND

RESOLVED that in accordance with the previously agreed criteria grant of no more than one-third up to a maximum of £1,500 be made from the Welsh Church Fund to the following.

(a) Calvary Evangelical Church, Penybryn

Disabled access to the premises was to be constructed at an estimated cost of £12,900. The maximum grant had been requested.

(b) Sardis United Reformed Church

The meeting closed at 3.55 p.m.

Repairs have recently been carried out to the Church roof. This was the start of a large project to improve the state of the Church building. Total cost of the first stage is £5,626 and a grant of £1,500 was sought.
