

Improvement Objectives

IO1 - Ensure children and young people who are looked after are supported to achieve their full potential.

Outcomes:

1. CCBC will have recruited more foster carers in order to meet the placement needs of children requiring foster placements. We want to reduce the number of Independent Fostering Agency placements that we use and ensure children are placed within the Borough to access local services when ever possible. We aim to improve Placement Stability for children, to promote more positive outcomes.
2. We want to improve the timeliness for children who require adoptive placements to be matched with and placed with adoptive families.
3. We hope to increase the education attainment levels of all Looked after children (LAC) in an education setting.
4. We want to increase the number of young people engaged in education, training and employment so it gives them the best opportunities and part of that is to build upon arrangements to place young people in suitable accommodation.

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Quarter 2 Progress Summary

What have we done well over the last six months?

- Formally launched the new 16 Plus Service
- Implemented the revised Homeless Protocol for 16/17 year olds in partnership with Housing and the Third Sector
- Confirmed commitment to the development of the South East Wales Adoption Service (SEWAS) which will now become fully operational in 2014
- Improved performance in respect of completion of Personal Education Plans (PEP's) for Looked After Children – 86% compared to 76% for the same period last year.

What areas do we need to improve on? and how are we going to do it?

SCC/033f – Percentage of former LAC in education/ training/ employment at age 19:

Members will clearly focus on the need to encourage young people to gain employment or engage in education and training. However, the number of young people that fall into this PI category is very small – 11 young people, so the percentage can be distorted by small variations. The reality is that the current cohort of young people, 5 out of 11 young people that this PI relates to, have particular issues in their lives or such complex needs or high levels of vulnerability that they are unable to engage. Of the 5 young people unable to engage; 1 is in Secure Accommodation, 2 are pregnant young women and 2 are disabled young people. These factors will continue to impact upon performance for the remainder of the year. We are in regular contact with these young people and offering support and advice to assist them to get back into education/training or employment.

However, it is important to note that this is a common feature reported across Wales and the year to date performance of 54.5% for Caerphilly compares favourably to the Welsh Average for 2012/13 of 56.4%.

CSPI_03 – The number of foster carers recruited:

This local measure is slightly below the target set for the first six months. However, despite recruitment campaigns, the Council is dependent upon applications being made by the public. The target of 25 new foster carers in a year is extremely ambitious and should be reviewed.

Children's services continue to promote the well-being of looked after children and strive to promote placement stability and educational opportunities. This is evidenced in quarter 2 PI updates as the percentage of looked after children who experience one or more changes of school and the those who have had more than three placements are both below target.

As at September, we had 86.70% of looked after children receiving a personal education plan within the first 20 school days. These are also addressed via regular Looked After Children (LAC) reviews. 4. Build on the existing leaving care team by developing a 16+ team and ensure the Council remains in contact with and supports the children leaving care.	The Sixteen plus team was officially launched on the 6th September 2013. There will be a period of transfer of cases but it is hoped that the team will take responsibility for all 16 plus looked after children cases and homeless young people from end of September 2013. 5. Contribute to the development of a single, integrated Adoption Service for Gwent	Work is progressing to develop a single integrated Adoption Service for Gwent. There remains a national shortage of adopters, particularly for adopters of sibling groups and children with additional needs.
