During the spring and early summer, time has been spent on securing funds to keep the trusts and its partners objectives a reality, the following information sets out the grants which have been applied for:-

Funding Application (Successful)

Restoration of Drapers lock lower Cwmbran

Trusthouse Charitable Foundation \pounds 25,000 Torfaen CBC match funding \pounds 25,000

Restoration of Drapers Lock

The Trust and TCBC having been successful and given the go-ahead to start investing in materials for the project which commenced during March/April 2011. The final £10,900.00 payment from the TCFC was received in June.

Progress to date

Site office and materials store set up.

Restoration team have been clearing the offside and erecting security fence, clearing debris and installing clay dame at head of chamber.

Main lock chamber has been de-watered and debris cleared.

Training in the use of Lime Mortar has been arranged for the volunteers

Waterway Recovery Group will be carrying out a work camp between the 9th and 23rd Julv.

Torfaen CBC HLF Application to restore 8 Lock from Pentre Road to Ty Coch Top Lock was part successful with £40,000.00 being granted towards the preparation of a Development and Environmental Plan.

Consultants were appointed in May and have already carried out an Engineering and Environmental assessment. A first stage public consultation workshop took place during the last week of June.

The total HLF grant application will be £500,000.00

Newport City Homes – Environmental Improvement Fund

Application was successful.

The trust received £2,844.00 to improve Wheelchair access onto the canal at Cefn Bridge and provide Educational & Community Pond Dipping Facilities in Lock 18 side pond.

The improved wheelchair part of the project has been completed cost £1,584.00.

Entrust, (Project No 842916.003)

Landfill Credit Fund (Newport Waste) £48,500.00

This project will enable further landscaping works to be carried out at Cefn Flight of Fourteen Locks on the Crumlin Arm to complete Phase 1 of the restoration of Locks 17, 18, 19, 20 the project will include:

Reinstatement of Picnic Area (Completed) Reinstatement of 100m of footpaths (Completed) A further 300m still to complete.

WCVA (Wales Council for Volunteer Action)

These grants aim to make a significant contribution to raising levels of employment and reduce economic inactivity through structured and relevant work experience, build confidence and skills for the unemployed to move into a sustainable career.
