**DIRECTORATE SAVINGS PROPOSALS**

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To update Members on a number of potential medium term financial plan (MTFP) savings for 2014/15 which were subject to queries at the last meeting of the Scrutiny Committee held on 10th December 2013.

#### 2. SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Regeneration and Environment Scrutiny Committee met on 10th December 2013 to consider a report on the Directorate of the Environment potential MTFP savings for 2014/15.
- 2.2 The report was supplemented by presentations by each of the Heads of Service which covered the potential items in greater detail.
- 2.3 At the meeting on 10th December 2013, Members expressed a wish to consider a number of the items in greater detail at a future meeting early in 2014. The purpose of this meeting is therefore to allow further scrutiny of these items.

# 3. LINKS TO STRATEGY

- 3.1 The financial climate affecting Local Government has become clearer since the Welsh Government announced the Local Government settlement in October 2013.
- 3.2 The setting of a balanced budget for 2014/15 is a duty of the full Council and planning for the medium term and aligning service priorities accordingly remains an integral part of Caerphilly County Boroughs financial and strategic management processes.

4.1 At the meeting of 10th December 2013, Scrutiny Committee members requested further information and discussion on the savings proposals listed below:-

# 4.1.1 Regeneration and Planning

- Capital Investment car parking at country parks
- The suggested savings target at 84% of the total budget in relation to enhanced maintenance budget.

# 4.1.2 Community & Leisure Services

- Cease provision of management grants to bowls clubs and Aber Valley splash pool
- Introduce a van and trailer ban at civic amenity sites
- Introduce double shift working for mechanical sweepers
- · Closure of cafeteria in Caerphilly Leisure centre
- Closure of public conveniences
- Charging for all replacement and new issue waste containers
- · Review weekend park cleansing service
- · Introduce charges for garden waste collection

- Licensing Fees
