

# **RIGHTS OF WAY COMMITTEE - 23RD NOVEMBER 2004**

SUBJECT: DIVERSION OF FOOTPATH NO. 57 IN THE COMMUNITY OF

**BEDWELLTY** 

REPORT BY: DIRECTOR OF THE ENVIRONMENT

### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise Members of a request for diversion in respect of footpath No. 57 in the Community of Bedwellty.

#### 2. LINKS TO STRATEGY

- 2.1 Environmental improvements, sustainable development
- 2.2 The Authority has a duty to maintain the Definitive Map and Statement

#### 3. THE REPORT

- 3.1 An application has been made by the Director of Education and Leisure for the diversion of footpath No. 57 in the Community of Bedwellty.
- 3.2 The location of the path is indicated on Document No. 1.
- 3.3 The route of the existing public path is shown on the Monmouthshire County Council definitive map, relevant date 1st July 1952, attached as Document No. 2.
- 3.4 The definitive route is also shown in more detail on Document No. 3 by a bold black line between points A B C.
- 3.5 The path is described in the definitive statement as;

Type and Number of path; Footpath No. 57 Bedwellty

Name of Path; Pengam Road

Justification for Right of Way; Maintained by Local Authority

Survey Date; F. Johnson, 81 Bedwellty Road, Aberbargoed 17 June

1952

Description of Path; Footpath commences at gate in north east corner of Park

fence (gate missing) on Bedwellty Road proceeds in southwesterly direction. Footpath 2`6" wide, well defined. Was probably ashed but ash washed away. Crosses

footpath 56 and 57

- 3.6 The proposed diversion is shown on plan (Document No. 3) by a bold black dashed line between points A D C.
- 3.7 The application is a result of an accident that occurred on the proposed path. Investigation reveals that no previous diversion order has been processed to accommodate the development of the pavilion and playing fields. The diversion will acknowledge the route as a

right of way.

3.8 The Authority has undertaken a pre-order consultation exercise and no objections have been received.

# 7. RECOMMENDATIONS

7.1 That a diversion order be processed under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1981 to divert footpath No. 57 in the Community of Bedwellty in accordance with the following description;

Description of Existing Path or Way (Document No. 3)

That part of footpath No. 57 in the Community of Bedwellty commencing at a point on Bedwellty Road north of the garage approximately 48 metres north west of the property known as Parc Coed and proceeding in a curved north westerly direction to a point 320 north west of the said property a total distance of 280 metres or thereabouts and shown on plan by a bold black line between points C - B - A

Description of Alternative Path or Way (Document No. 3)

A new path to a width of 1.8 metres commencing at a point on Bedwellty Road north of the garage approximately 48 metres north west of the property known as Parc Coed and proceeding in a west north westerly, northerly, north westerly, westerly and curved north westerly directions to its termination at a point 320 north west of the said property a total distance of 296 metres or thereabouts and shown on plan by a bold black dashed line between points C-D-A
