## 1. APOLOGIES

#### 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor D. Carter declared an interest in Item 4, Applications for Financial Assistance Appendix 2, General Criteria Awards. Details are minuted with the respective item.

#### 3. MINUTES – 25TH SEPTEMBER 2015

The Panel received and approved the minutes of the Grants to the Voluntary Sector Panel held on 15th July 2015 (minute nos. 1 - 7).

#### 4. APPLICATIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

# 4.1 Statement of Expenditure

Members noted the budget available for 2015-2016 as £67,933.11, which included the estimated reduction for Discretionary Rate Relief and budget carried forward. If all awards in the report are agreed the remaining budget would be £50,013.11. This balance will be carried forward to the 2016/17 financial year.

#### 4.2 Welsh Church Act Fund

Members noted the Welsh Church Act Fund applications received and approved by officers since the last meeting in accordance with the agreed criteria as set out in Appendix 3. The total allocated amounts to £7,479.00.

Members noted that if all awards spend to their maximum allocation there would be a remaining balance of £174,518.33, which will be carried forward into the next financial year. Monmouthshire County Council have advised that the provisional allocation for 2016-17 would be £61,600, resulting in a total available budget for 2016/17 of £236,118.33. Concerns were raised that there is a large balance remaining within the fund.

Following consideration and discussion it was moved and seconded that Officers seek advice from other Local Authorities on their allocation processes for the fund and provide a report at the next meeting for Members to consider and make recommendations to Cabinet. By a show of hands, this was unanimously agreed.

#### 4.3 Applications for Financial Assistance: Panel Awards

Members were asked to consider the applications listed in Appendix 1 to the report and to make appropriate recommendations to the Interim Head of Corporate Finance for approval.

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To present the Panel with the applications for financial assistance received to date for the current financial year.

#### 2. SUMMARY

2.1 The report advises Panel members of the budget allocations for both the Voluntary Sector budget and the "Welsh Church Fund" and provides details of applications received.

#### 3. LINKS TO STRATEGY

3.1 Voluntary and Community Sector organisations make an important contribution to public service provision across the borough and are key participants in the Community Strategy implemented through the Single Integrated Plan Caerphilly Delivers. The Single Integrated Plan has the following priority outcomes: Prosperous Caerphilly; Safer Caerphilly; Learning Caerphilly and Healthier Caerphilly.

#### 4. REPORT

# 4.1 Assistance To Voluntary Sector Budget

4.1.1 The Panel's budget for 2016/2017 is as follows:

Carry forward balance from 2015-16	£90,973.56

- 4.1.2 The projected Discretionary Rate Relief for 2016-17 is £154,859.52. Allowing for the projected spend on the Discretionary Rate Relief the available balance for schemes is £109,162.04 which includes the carry forward balances.
- 4.1.3 The total amount requested in respect of the applications listed in Appendix 1 is £1,170.00 (5 No.). These applications do not meet the criteria as set out in Appendix 4. Panel Members are asked to consider these applications and make appropriate recommendations to the Interim Head of Corporate Finance for approval or otherwise under delegated powers.
- 4.1.4 Appendix 2 details those applications that meet the criteria set out in Appendix 4 that have been approved by officers (but not actioned). These total £8,960.00 (43 No.).
- 4.1.5 The balance remaining if all grants requested are awarded as set out in Appendix 1 and Appendix 2 will be £99,032.04.

#### 4.2 Welsh Church Act Fund

- 4.2.1 At previous meetings of the Panel it was decided that the following criteria would apply when considering applications for assistance from the Welsh Church Fund:-
  - (i) A grant of no more than £2,000 to be given to partly fund projects of £6,000 and over;
  - (ii) Smaller projects less than £6,000 be grant aided up to a third of the total cost;
  - (iii) All organisations receiving grants produce the necessary financial records to show the expenditure has been incurred;
  - (iv) No organisation is allowed to apply in consecutive years.
- 4.2.2 At the meeting of 13th July 2009 Members agreed that in future, officers would approve applications meeting the Welsh Church Act Fund Criteria, using delegated powers. Such decisions would then be reported to the Panel for information, where Members could ask for further information if required.
- 4.2.3 Caerphilly County Borough Council has received written confirmation from Monmouthshire CC that the 2016/17 budget allocation will be £61,600.00. Monmouthshire CC have confirmed that the underspends from previous years of £174,518.33 can be carried forward, resulting in a total available budget for the current year of £236,118.33.

- 4.2.5 Appendix 5 contains a list of previously approved applications that have exceeded the 18 month time limit to claim funding as set out in the Terms and Conditions. These applicants have been advised the grant has now been withdrawn. These withdrawn grants total £5,568.00 (3 No.)
- 4.2.6 Members will recall that at the last meeting of the Panel it was agreed that officers would seek advice from other Local Authorities on their allocation processes for the Welsh Church Fund and would provide a report for Panel Members to consider and make recommendations to Cabinet. Much of this information has now been received but the Interim Head of Corporate

Finance needs to seek advice from the Interim Head of Legal Services & Monitoring Officer on the appropriate process to follow to agree any changes to the process currently operating in Caerphilly CBC. A further update/report will be provided at the next meeting of the Panel.
