## **CABINET MEMBER ACTIVITY**

I also met regularly with Heads of Service, Directors, the Chief Executive, Police and Crime Commissioner and Trade Unions with regard to my portfolio priorities.

#### WARD ACTIVITY

During lockdown I continued carrying out my role as a Councillor, representing my community and providing assistance during a difficult time.

I am a member of the Ael y Bryn Community Centre Management Committee and was also re-elected Secretary of the Pen y Dre Tenants & Residents Association. I am now also a Trustee of Rhymney Trust which decides on funding community groups in the Rhymney area.

I continue to meet on a Quarterly basis with the local Tenants & Residents Association, the police, community safety, dog warden, environmental health and the housing team to discuss and deal with issues within the ward.

I met with Jeff Cuthbert, Police Commissioner, regarding community safety concerns in Rhymney along with our AM, MP and other Councillors.

Worked with Gerald Jones MP and hosted a Jobs Fayre at Ael y Bryn Community Centre.

Continue to hold joint surgeries with our Assembly Member Dawn Bowden and Street Surgeries with our Member of Parliament Gerald Jones & Dawn Bowden.

Work is still ongoing regarding the £4.2M Regeneration Programme at Rowan Place. I am also part of the Multi Agency Group to look at tackling the wider issues in this area. Over the coming months I will be working with residents to implement the Environmental Programme in this area.

Organised a remembrance service at our new memorial garden in Princetown and Tafarnaubach, honouring those who served in the two world wars.

Held a number of public meetings and advice sessions for residents regarding the unauthorised development on Rhymney Bridge. The matter formed a planning application for a Gypsy/Traveller Site that was refused at Planning Committee and the applicant has appealed. I'm still working with residents and council departments regarding ongoing issues at Rhymney Bridge.

I will continue to support local community groups and residents regarding issues affecting our area to ensure our place is a better place to live.
