WARD ACTIVITY

During lockdown I continued carrying out my role as a Councillor, representing my community and providing assistance during a difficult time.

However, we tend to concentrate on door to door contact with residents and covered the majority of the ward during the year. I also received regular contact and enquiries from residents via letter, email or telephone.
