# WARD ACTIVITY

We supported our constituents with their objections to the development and attended the planning meetings with them.

I have been involved with a number of other on-going issues which include:-

I would like to apologise to my constituents for not being available during the latter part of 2019 and beginning of 2020, as I suffered a very personal bereavement. I am grateful to my ward colleague Cllr Teresa Parry, who I know was available to you during this time.

Since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020, constituents have asked me to help distribute bereavement notices in the community as, due to social distancing and lockdown restrictions, neighbours/friends were unable to attend funerals. This allowed the community to come together on their doorstep, and show their final respects to the family and acknowledge the loss of their loved ones.
